



COLOR THE HISTORY OF MONEY





So people looked for something that everyone wanted to use as money. They used shells, furs, salt, feathers and tobacco for early money. Then metal was used because it was both strong and useful.










Paper money was the invented by Chinese many centuries ago, but it wasn't until the 1500's that it was used in Europe. Paper money (notes or bills) are promises to pay, made by the government. Paper is easier to use for paying large amounts of money.

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1 QUARTER=25 CENTS \$.25=25¢


*If you keep on saving pennies, until you're up to fifty; You've saved 1 HALF-DOLLAR, by being very thrifty.
